The Scholastic Book Fair will be visiting on 16th November to 21st November.

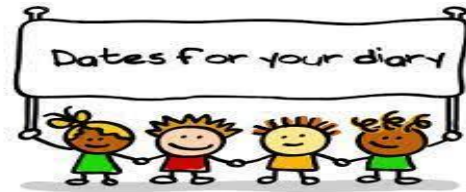
